# MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Saturday singers is a community choir run entirely by volunteers. It employs a Musical Director Tina Hewitt and Piano Accompanist Ed Hodgkinson,

There is no audition or previous musical knowledge needed to join. We only ask that you enjoy singing.

Rehearsals take place from 09:30 am to 12.00 am on Saturdays at the Masonic Hall, Goldsmith street, Nottingham (nearest tram stop is by the Theatre Royal)

There is a break at 10:45 am and if you wish you can buy a coffee or tea in the bar area. After rehearsal some also stay and have lunch to enjoy some social time together.

Membership of the Choir is open to anyone over the age of 18 years:

- Irrespective of race, creed, colour, disability, gender or sexual orientation.
- Who has a wish to sing with others.
- Who shares our aims and objectives
- The committee may suspend any member considered to have acted in a manner likely to be prejudicial to the objectives or status of the choir.

The objectives of the choir are:

- a) To encourage participation in the enjoyment of singing, amongst all sections of society.
- b) To encourage fellowship through common goals and shared
- c) To support both local and national charities via concert income.

Subscriptions will be set as a sum per term to cover each of the choirs three terms these can be paid by bank transfer, cash or cheque and are dealt with by the Treasurer.

We ask for personal information when someone joins. We ask for your consent for the committee to hold your information and is collected for the purpose of keeping you informed of choir activities by the Secretary.

All personal information is held securely by the committee.

You can ask the Chairman for your details to be removed from our lists at any time by written request. Your details will then be removed from our lists.

Occasionally photographs will be taken during rehearsals/Concerts/Choir lunches to be used ONLY to promote choir via Website and Facebook.

If you do NOT want to be included in these photographs please advise Chairman in writing.

Dress Code for Concert

- a) Ladies will wear black outfits, (long skirts, trousers with a black blouse or top or dress) with long or three quarter length sleeves with a cerise scarf.
- b) Men will wear black dinner suits with matching bow ties and pocket handkerchiefs same colour as the scarves.

All scarves, bow ties and pocket handkerchiefs are supplied by the choir and will be given out at each concert and will be handed back in at the end of the concert.
